What's Happening?

FEMA & Special Flood Hazard Area ~Jackie Curley, BCA VP

Did you know that some houses in the Baytree community are considered by FEMA to be in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA -Zone A). However, according to Frank Skarvelis, Brevard County Floodplain Administer, most houses in Baytree are built on fill and should not be considered in Zone A. Unless this designation is removed by a specific determination from FEMA, a future purchaser of your house, if seeking a mortgage, or if you have a mortgage, will be required to purchase flood

insurance.

To determine if your house is located in Zone A, visit FEMA.gov and enter your address on the FEMA Flood Map Service Center. If your house is located in Zone A, you can call Frank Skarvelis, Brevard County Floodplain Administrator (321-617-7340) to determine if previous owners of your house have already received a reclassification determination from FEMA. If not. Mr. Skarvelis can be very helpful in providing all the documentation required to submit a reclassification request to FEMA. Although Flood Insurance would not be required you may still want to carry flood insurance.

BCA Updates

When I went to the mailbox today, I had my first "love note" from Fairways Violations. Who the heck is Fairway Violations, and what could they want from me. I quickly opened the very official looking post. To my chagrin, my tree limbs were not trimmed to some precise height above the sidewalk. I immediately glanced at my oak and thought it looked pretty good. At first I was puzzled. Then I felt a burst of adrenaline. My faced flushed. Yup. I was mad. Who do these guys think they are telling me to trim my tree! I know how to take care of my property. I focused on my neighbor's oak across the street. It looked just like mine. Wonder if he got a letter like mine. I resisted the urge to go measure his branches in favor of driving around Baytree and seeing how the other oaks were looking. Mine might have been a little low, but not a big deal.

Where did Fairway Violations come up with this idea to send me this nasty gram? I read my letter closely, talked with a few neighbors, and eventually ended up reading something called BPARCS - Baytree Policies and Architectural Review Committee Standards. I vaguely began to remember hearing about this at my house closing, and even signing a document telling me I was buying in a Deed Restricted Community, and would abide by its rules and regulations. Guess it was time for me to brush up on those.

As I waded through page after page, I began to realize that I agreed with most of what I was reading. In fact, that's why I bought my home in Baytree. It was a safe, upscale, beautiful neighborhood. These BPARCS were always evolving over time and ensuring that our community was staying modern and relevant. They were in fact protecting my investment too!

I'm sure it's a tough job making sure rules and regulations are enforced fairly and consistently. I'm reminded of something I heard a few years back. It Takes a Village. I guess it takes all of us to remember why we moved here in the first place. After all, keeping our neighborhood one of the most sought after communities in central Florida is hard work. I don't get mad anymore when I get my "love notes" from Fairway. I just ask myself how I missed seeing that myself. I'm glad we are all working together.

Update From The Treasurer ~Arthur Hudson, Treasurer

Well, this is my first year as Treasurer on the Baytree Community Association (BCA) Board. All of my professional career was working with numbers. To me working with numbers was/is fun, especially when they have dollar signs in front of them. However, I have learned over the years that not everyone shares my enthusiasm. I've participated in financial presentations where some in the audience were checking their watches hoping that we would finish soon, others had their eyes glassed over, while a few were even nodding off. So, if you are someone that is not excited by numbers, no worries, I will not be discussing the details of the BCA financial data in this newsletter.

What I will tell you is that we just closed out calendar year 2021 with a strong Balance Sheet and a solid cash position. We exceeded our income budget while underrunning expenses after adjusting for a non-recurring contribution to the CDD. We shared in the cost of the annual holiday lighting at the front and back gates with the CDD and contributed to the planned playground equipment at the pavilion area. In addition, we supported several very successful social events, thank you Sue Frontera and your team.

We have established our annual budget for calendar year 2022 which again includes a cost sharing for the holiday lighting and several more social events. As you drive or walk through Baytree you can see evidence of where the BCA has contributed to the beauty of our community and enhanced the value of the investment in your home. A few examples are the pavilion, pavilion parking, benches, holiday lighting and soon the playground equipment. We will continue to work with the CDD to explore ways in which we can cooperate to keep Baytree the premiere community in this area.

As I mentioned earlier, we exceeded our income budget for 2021. What contributed to this were fines and penalties assessed for violations of the Baytree Policies and Architectural Review Committee Standards (BPARCS). We urge all Baytree residents to read and become familiar with the BPARCS so we can avoid issuing any fines in the future and maintain Baytree as the beautiful community that it is.

ARC Committee Update

Landscape Trimming DIY (do it yourself): There are many NEW homeowners in Baytree. Some of them are doing their own landscape trimming, which is admirable. If you are one of these homeowners please be advised of the following B-PARCS (available on our website at baytreeca.org) that may have an impact on your work: 4.6.7.7G-2: Landscape debris cannot be placed at the curbside BEFORE the Sunday evening PRIOR to the collection day.

Also bear in mind that branches, limbs and trunks must be no longer than 4' in length, must weigh less than 50 lbs and be uniformly stacked at the curbside. If not done this way, Waste Management may not collect it on their weekly routine pickup. For homeowners that have a contracted service for landscape trimmings, please be aware that Brevard County requires all lawn and tree contractors to REMOVE yard trash generated from their operations. So, if your landscaper tells you they are allowed to leave their debris at the curb for Waste Management to pick up, this is not true. It is THEIR responsibility. All these requirements listed above are an effort to avoid unsightly landscape debris sitting at the curbside for days waiting for pickup.

The ARC Committee meets every other Monday at 8:30 AM at the pavilion (weather permitting...then at the clubhouse). The date is posted on the front gate bulletin board. If you have a question or want some input into an exterior home improvement, please come to our meeting or email me at arcmanager@baytreeca.org. We REALLY do want to help you, not hinder you.



What is the difference between the Baytree Community Association (BCA) and the Baytree Community Development District (CDD)?

BCA – Baytree is a deed restricted community with policies, regulations and user restrictions that are binding on all homeowners and occupants. The BCA has the duty to enforce these rules for the benefit of Baytree resident property values and quality of life. The BCA also sponsors various social activities for resident adults and children. And, too, the BCA cooperates with the CDD to help fund projects like our Pavilion, playground equipment and holiday lighting.

CDD – The CDD is responsible for all of the common areas which includes the following: Security, Landscaping, Monuments, Recreation facilities, Streets, Sidewalks, and Lakes (except the one at the front gate which is owned by the golf course). The CDD is considered a government entity and consists of five elected Supervisors that are elected in the general election and serve a term of 4 years. Each Supervisor is responsible for one or two of the above areas.

PARKING:

A couple of things to note:

- There is no parking on any street in Baytree from 2:00 AM – 7:00 AM.
- At no time are vehicles to block the sidewalks when parked in driveways.
- Vehicles parking along the street must park in the direction of traffic and stay off the grassy berm.

Planning A Change to Your House Exterior or Landscaping?

Remember to submit an ARC application for landscaping, tree removal, house painting as well as those exterior projected listed in the Guidelines found on the website. The board does have the authority to have unapproved work be removed.
