Architectural Review Committee (ARC) Update ~Rick Brown, ARC Mgr

At the time of this writing, mid November, we are heading into the end of the hurricane season. I hope we have nothing after Rafael. We have had enough "fun" for this season.

Please be aware that as of November 30th ALL hurricane shutters must be taken down or in the open position (unless there is a pending storm). There are very specific requirements inthe Bylaws (Covenants). See Section 13.21.11, titled Hurricane and Storm Protection. These covenants are Strictly Enforced, so please be aware of them to avoid any violations and/or fines.

Another way to avoid a violation letter is to ensure your landscapers are removing the yard waste they generate. As a result of Hurricane Milton, there was quite a lot of landscape damage(tree limbs, palm fronds, etc) which took the county a number of weeks (some say too many) to remove. It was noted that some homeowners brought in landscape companies to do additional pruning and left their debri at the curbside as well. This is in direct VIOLATION OF SECTION 4.6.7.7G OF THE B-PARCS. ALL lawn and tree contractors are REQUIRED by Brevard County Ordinance to remove yard trash generated from their operations. You should be aware of this requirement.



With that said....Now its time for the FUN time of year.....THE HOLIDAY SEASON!!! Now is the time to break out the Holiday Lights and compete with your neighbor for the "best holiday lighting display". Don't worry about the January electric bill, just go crazy and LIGHT UP YOUR HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS!! Baytree covenants support holiday property decorations and state they can remain on display from

Thanksgiving to January 10th. So, let the festivities begin!! Test those light strands, get out the cartoon characters, dust off Santa and the Grinch, find those reindeer, get out the ladder to climb the trees to string those lights (be careful PLEASE) and turn your yard into a winter wonderland. In Florida SNOW is not required.

BE AWARE that if you are going to install computer generated lighting in your soffits or outlining your roof line and leave them up year round, you will need ARC approval for that: B-PARCS 2.6.

Why Choose Cape Canaveral To Launch Rockets?

Until after World War II the cape was a stretch of barren, sandy scrubland. In 1947, it \was chosen as the site for a missile testing range. The traits that kept settlers away, made the cape a perfect site for a missile range. The Cape was relatively isolated from populated areas, but it was accessible by road, rail and shipping, and the weather was good most of the year. In addition, it provided a huge over-water flight area removed from populated land masses and shipping lanes.

Cape Canaveral also was located near the Equator, which would prove to be an asset in ballistic missile testing and eventually space launches. Rockets launched from the Cape could take advantage of the rotational speed of the Earth, which is greatest at the Equator. The relative position of Cape Canaveral required less rocket engine thrust than would have been necessary elsewhere.



The additional fact that the Banana River Naval Air Station was available for occupation as headquarters just 15 miles south of Cape Canaveral caused military leaders to push ahead with the development of a missile range in Florida.
